Ronald H. Balson is a Chicago trial attorney, an educator, and writer. His practice has taken him to several international venues. While in Poland Ron was profoundly moved by the scars and memorials of World War II, which inspired him to write *Once We Were Brothers*, his first novel. Travel to the Middle East provided backdrop for his second novel *Saving Sophie*. *Karolina's Twins* is the story of one woman's courage to survive the concentration camps. His newest novel *The Girl from Berlin*, set in Tuscany, continues with the investigative team introduced in his first novel. Ron was a finalist for the Harper Lee Award for Legal Fiction in 2014 and a finalist for the Premio Bancarella Italian Literature Award in 2014.

Eileen McNamara is Professor of the Practice of Journalism and Director of the Journalism Program at Brandeis University. She teaches courses such as Political Packaging in America, Ethics in Journalism, Media and Public Policy and Race and Gender in the News. She is formerly a columnist with the *Boston Globe* where she won the Pulitzer Prize for Commentary. She contributed to the *Boston Globe's* coverage of the clergy sexual abuse scandal by recommending that the Spotlight Team look further into the cases she had reported on previously. In the film *Spotlight* Eileen was played by actress Maureen Keiller.

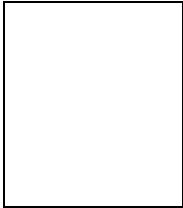
