10. SUFFRAGISTS IN WASHINGTON, DC: THE 1913 PARADE AND THE FIGHT FOR THE VOTE

Rebecca Boggs Roberts, Author and Program Coordinator for Smithsonian Associates, will trace the heroic struggle of Alice Paul and the National Woman's Party as they worked to earn the vote for women. Despite sixty years of campaigning by suffrage organizations, by 1913 only six states allowed women to vote. Then suffragist Alice Paul came to Washington, D.C. She planned a grand spectacle on Pennsylvania Avenue the day before Woodrow Wilson's inauguration, marking the beginning of a more aggressive strategy on the part of the women's suffrage movement. These tactics finally led to the ratification of the Nineteenth Amendment in 1920. Join Ms. Roberts as she recounts the story of this important era in our nation's history. 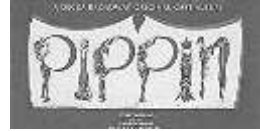
