The economic sanctions imposed on Iraq by the United Nations Security Council caused massive damage to the Iraqi population, and to Iraq's health care, education, economy, and infrastructure. To this day, Iraq has not yet recovered. Von Sponeck and Gordon will discuss the moral implications of this, as well as offer some thoughts about what this tells us about the current use of sanctions in Iran and elsewhere."
