Charles Belfoure

Author of *The Paris Architect* and *House of Thieves*



Charles Belfoure is an architect by profession and has no creative writing background. A graduate of Pratt Institute and Columbia University, he specializes in historic preservation, mainly in Baltimore.

The Paris Architect, his first novel, was on the New York Times Bestseller list. StudioCanal is finalizing a movie production of it. *House of Thieves*, his second novel, will be made into a TV series by the Mark Gordon Group and Francis Lawrence, director of *The Hunger Games* films.

Mr. Belfoure has also written architectural histories, including *Monuments to Money: The Architecture of American Banks* (2011), and *Edmund Lind: Anglo-American Architect of Baltimore and the South* (2009). He is the co-author of *Niernsee & Neilson, Architects of Baltimore* (2006) and *The Baltimore Rowhouse* (2001).

Mr. Belfoure has won multiple awards for his books from the Maryland Historical Trust.
